Introduction

Golden Gate University, a private nonprofit university, has been helping adults achieve their professional goals by providing undergraduate and graduate education in accounting, law, taxation, business, and related areas since 1901.

GGU traces its origins to an evening lecture series started by the San Francisco YMCA during the California Gold Rush.

The first degree-conferring program of the university started in 1901, with the formation of California's first evening law school. By offering classes at night, Golden Gate University made legal studies available to the working adult. Four students comprised the law school's first graduating class.

Today, Golden Gate University is a leader in graduate and undergraduate education in law, accounting, taxation, business and related professions. As always, GGU emphasizes hands-on learning taught primarily by professionals practicing in the field or with substantial professional experience. Our main campus is located in San Francisco, with learning sites in Seattle, Silicon Valley and online through GGU's nationally recognized eLearning.

During its long and often colorful history, GGU has consistently been a pacesetter:

- Opened the first night school in San Francisco. Initially begun in the mid-1850's, it became the YMCA Night School (1881), the YMCA Evening College (1894), Golden Gate College (1923), and finally Golden Gate University (1972).
- Started the first evening law school in California (1901), which was the third law school to open in Northern California. The Law school is accredited by the American Bar Association.
- Survived two major earthquakes, the 1906 quake that destroyed its building, and the 1989 Loma Prieta, which caused extensive damage to the east wing of the main campus in San Francisco.
- Began the West Coast's first four-year accounting program (1908). Golden Gate University counts among its alumni several winners of the Elijah Sells award for outstanding performance on the national CPA exam.
- Initiated Northern California's first evening program for students seeking an MBA degree (1950), and now annually confers the second most graduate degrees in business, tax, and accounting among universities in Northern California.
- Offered the first evening program in the Bay Area for students seeking the master of public administration degree.
- Was a leader in bringing the case-study method of instruction and the scholar/practitioner concept to the classroom, which is now widely used in business schools throughout the world.
- Provides the nation's largest tax school with in-person and online instructional formats.
- Innovated military base programs from the 1960s through the 1990s - a spirit that continues today in the programs offered to our veterans and active duty students with online degree programs and participation in the Yellow Ribbon Program.

RECESSIONAL

Professor Solomon Darwin has broad leadership experience in corporate management and academia. As an expert in "open innovation" and "open business models," he is an adviser to senior executives of multinationals and government leaders in the emerging world. The list includes large elite global brands and government entities in Europe, China, Russia, India, South Korea, Turkey, Thailand, Canada, Latin America, and Mexico. He directs and moderates international innovation conferences and forums, and chairs quarterly Chief Innovation Officer round tables in the Silicon Valley.

Academic Costume

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. Students and teachers wore long gowns and hoods for protection against the cold of unheated buildings. During the 14th century, Oxford and Cambridge prescribed a definite academic dress. The European universities followed; however, their academic dress had a great diversity of specification and color. American colleges and universities opted for a definite system for all institutions to use. In 1895, representatives of American schools codified standards for academic dress with the establishment of the Intercollegiate Dress Code.

THE GOWN: The flowing gown comes from the twelfth century. Traditionally it is black for all degrees. The bachelor's gown is relatively simple, with long, pleated front panels, and intricate shirring across the shoulders and back. The gown is worn closed and distinguished by its long, pointed sleeves. The master's gown is also relatively simple. It has a very long sleeve, oblong in shape, with an arc cut out of the bottom of the front. The gown may be worn open or closed. Gowns for doctoral degrees may also be worn opened or closed. The sleeves are bell shaped and carry five-inch wide velvet panels all the way to the bottom of the garment. Three horizontal velvet bars are stitched on the upper arm of the sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the academic discipline to which the degree refers.

THE CAP: When Roman law freed slaves, they won the privilege of wearing a cap. The academic cap is a sign of freedom of scholarship and the responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square to symbolize the book. The cap worn almost universally in academic processions is the Oxford cap, better known as the mortarboard. The tassel may either be black or reflect the scholarly subject, although only doctoral degree recipients may have gold thread. A different style cap, the Cambridge cap, resembles a large beret also known as a tam.

THE HOOD: The hood is the most distinguishing feature of all academic costumes. Originally, it seems to have had three uses: As a head covering, as a shoulder cape, or, when hung from the shoulder, as a bag in which alms could be collected. The size and shape of the American hood marks the college degree of the wearer. The hood's outside is bordered with velvet of the proper width to indicate the degree and the proper color to indicate the department or field of study. The shape of master's hood and doctoral hood is similar, the former being three and one-half feet in length and the latter four feet. The respective widths of the velvet borders are three inches for the master's and five inches for the doctoral hoods. The covered lining inside the hood is the official color of the institution conferring the degree. Thus, the lining for the GGU hood is blue.
